

Facebook: Gained 1,329 followers Impressions are up 14% Link clicks are up 27%


Instagram: Gained 3,202 new followers Impressions are up 36% Engagements are up 33%

- We are now the FIRST LISTING on Google search for "St. Jacobs" (Above the Farmers Market and Explore Waterloo)!










